Over the years we had birds, snakes, a skunk, a sheep, squirrels, raccoons, rabbits, dogs, cats, a woodchuck, hamsters, opossums, guinea pigs, chinchillas, ferrets, a fox, a lizard, cans of meal worms tucked away in kitchen cabinets (food for the birds). Some were pets, many were injured or orphaned animals/birds that were brought in, fed and cared for, then released back into the wild. She brought animals into the Burr School library when she worked there so that the children could learn about them.
